B) The Australian Bishops' Social Justice Statement "Cry of the Poor, Cry of the Earth" which was launched on August 5th. This document contains profound challenges and invites real responsibility from each of us. The deanery vision is for a network of animators across the deanery to bring this document to life in the Mountains. Given that our Diocese now has a "Peace, Justice and Ecology" team and that 30 of the Blue Mountains parishioners self-nominated for either the Social Justice or Laudate Si workshops it seems that the Spirit is calling us to put the theory into practice.



C. Another ongoing action at our least deanery meeting involved the upcoming Plenary Council to be held in October. The deaneries in the diocese were asked to submit their responses to the recently published "Agenda" for the Plenary Council.

As the Blue Mountains Deanery we have co-ordinated a number of dialogue groups and discernment groups within the Blue Mountains over the last three years. This collated Blue Mountains Deanery response has now been submitted to the Plenary Council. We ask for your prayers as this process is reaching an important highpoint for the Catholic Church in Australia.
